# Walks from Cwmffrwd Farm


- ✓ We are always **happy to chat** about local walks, just shout!



**AROUND THE FARM** - settle yourselves in with a gorgeous little walk around and above the farm...bridleway, mountain, stream and fields. Please note: the lower bridleway can be very wet and we recommend you keep dogs on leads as sheep are often grazing the mountain.

## 'Round the farm'


**30 mins to 45 mins**


- Turn left out of front gate
- Take first bridleway on right
- Walk up until it joins the mountain
- Walk up with the fence on your right
- Turn right at the corner of the fence line and start walking down (careful – it's steep)
- Cross the stream and continue to walk along the fence line until the path starts to descend slightly and you'll see the gate into our top field.

**WALKING FIELDS AND LANES BELOW THE FARM** – explore our local fields and lanes with this low-level walk below the farm. The bridleyway and fields can be wet and dogs must be on leads at all times to do this walk. You'll see horses, sheep, chickens, guinea fowl and dogs!

**Walking fields and lanes below the farm**  
30 – 45 minutes

- Turn right out of the farmyard and walk down the lane until you see the bridleway signposts on the left and right of the lane.
- Take the left-hand bridleway. This can be very wet and exciting – the stream has eroded lots of it so take a stick to balance on your journey! Kids will love this. Proper Indiana Jones territory!
- Turn left when you meet the bridleway at the bottom, walk this until you reach the lane, then follow lane to the grit box, turn left and walk lane home via the green barns (Ysgubor Ganol).
- *OR...if you don't fancy the bridleway then you can turn left out of the farm and walk the right of way down through the fields (note – there isn't a path, you just head down at a diagonal and avoid the ruin, this is dangerous and not a right of way), or you could make your walk shorter by returning across the fields instead.*



**WALKING THE BOTTOM BRIDLEWAY THAT PARALLELS THE RIVER** – explore our local bridleways and lanes with this low-level walk along the valley. The bridleway can be wet and dogs must be kept under careful control in case sheep have escaped onto the bridleway. There are little fords to cross and plenty of trees and squirrels to see!


**SHORT CUT  
THROUGH HIDDEN

- This is the shortcut through the hidden valley.
- *Best thing to do is count the fords you cross (x2) and then keep an eye out for the brideway sign that is up on the right-hand side of the bank that you take to short cut home!*



**ROUND THE SPUR** - stretch the legs with a bit more of a challenge and walk to the top of the spur...bridleway, mountain, stream and fields. The lower bridleway can be very wet and we recommend you keep dogs on leads as sheep are often grazing the mountain.

## 'Round the spur'

45 mins to 1 hour

- Turn left out of front gate
- Take first bridleway on right
- Walk up until it joins the mountain
- Keep stream on right as you ascend


At top of stream you can bear right onto the spur and come back down to the fence line to turn left and return via our top field.


- **OR**, follow the wall until you hit another bridleway that brings you down to the green barns.
- Turn right and head up lane to home.

**TO THE CAIRN** - This is a brilliant walk with lots of 'up' but fantastic views at the cairn...bridleway, mountain, stream and fields. The lower bridleway can be very wet and we recommend you keep dogs on leads as sheep are often grazing the mountain.


**2 – 3 hour walk**

**TO THE SUMMIT OF WAUN FACH (pronounced 'Wine Vak')** – This is a full day walk and can include a drink at The Dinas Castle Inn if they are open (search them up to check). The lower bridleyway can be very wet, and we recommend you keep dogs on leads as sheep are often grazing the mountain.

**2 hrs to summit, or 4/5 hrs full route**



There is a bridleyway below the pub carpark, use this to get you back onto our lane and NOT the main road to walk home.



## 3 - 4 hours


To walk to the summit of
